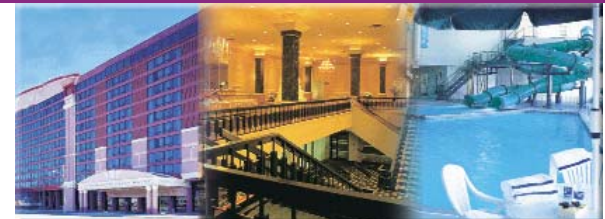

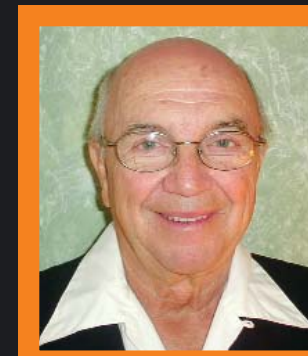

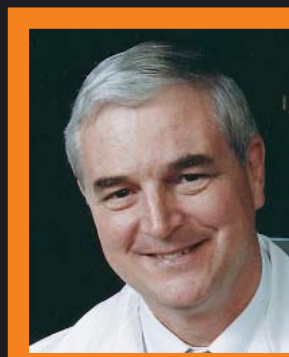

Curriculum Vitae

Dr. Terrance J. Spahl, B.S., D.D.S.

Dr. Spahl obtained a BS and DDS degree from the University of Minnesota completing his dental education in 1969. He has served on the Dental Surgery Committee of St. John's Hospital in St. Paul. Dr. Spahl has lectured on the subject of orthodontics and TMJ before both dental and medical groups. He has lectured for over two decades at seminars and dental meetings throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, South America, Australia and the Orient.

Dr. Spahl is a Certified Senior Instructor for the International Association of Orthodontics, and a member of the American Association for Functional Orthodontics. Dr. Spahl is on the Consulting Board of the TMJ Institute of America and a Board Member of the Functional Freedom Corporation. Dr. Spahl is the AAFO's representative to the Alliance of TMD Organizations National Committee and has served as a Dental Products Consultant with 3M Company. Dr. Spahl is the principal author of a trilogy of textbooks on orthodontics, maxillofacial orthopedics and TMJ therapeutics: "The Clinical Management of Basic Maxillofacial Orthopedic Appliances", Volume I: Mechanics, Volume II: Diagnostics, Volume III: Temporomandibular Joint. Dr. Spahl is also an orthodontic appliance design consultant and clinical lecturer for The Appliance Therapy Group and The Smile Foundation. Dr. Spahl has also authored numerous articles for various journals on the subject of orthodontics/TMJ.

Dr. James M. Broadbent, D.D.S., M.S.

Dr. Broadbent received his DDS degree from Northwestern University in 1969. Following dental school he completed a rotating dental internship at the University of Kentucky in 1970. He practiced general dentistry in Chicago and was an associate professor of Crown and Bridge at Northwestern prior to orthodontic specialty training. Dr. Broadbent completed his specialty program in 1973 and since has been in private practice providing Orthodontics and TMJ treatment in Provo, Utah. Dr. Broadbent has incorporated functional appliances in his practice since 1980. He attributes the tremendous growth of his practice to the utilization of the new techniques and appliances, which are very popular with his patients. Dr. Broadbent began teaching other practitioners in 1984. Over the years he has popularized the use of removable and functional appliances at local, state and international dental meetings, study groups and university graduate training programs.

Dr. Broadbent has published widely in professional journals. He has been a key speaker for the AAO, AOS, ADA and AAFO annual meetings. Dr. Broadbent has the ability to present orthodontic material in an interesting style and relaxed approach. He has made a significant contribution to the art and science of orthodontics and denofacial orthopedics in teaching, lecturing and the treatment of patients. Dr. Broadbent is a member of the American Association of Orthodontists and a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics and the American Academy of Pain Management.

Dr. Merle D. Bean, D.D.S.

Dr. Bean graduated in 1952 from the University of Iowa. In the period between 1952 and 1972, Dr. Bean pursued his orthodontic training from numerous orthodontic study associations and visits to orthodontists within the United States and Europe. Later he studied with the American Orthodontic Society, The International Association for Orthodontics and American Association of Functional Orthodontics.

In 1972 Dr. Bean started sharing his knowledge through "in office" seminars showing visiting dentists' techniques that worked. He became an early believer in functional appliances and second molar removal in crowded cases. He helped bring the maxillary advancement orthodontic knowledge to the United States by researching the use of the facemask.

Dr. Bean began lecturing throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico in the late seventies and has since lectured in Australia, Panama, England, New Zealand and represented the United States at the World Functional Orthodontic Society meeting in Brazil in 1985. That same year, the American Association for Functional Orthodontics named him "Man of the Year" for his contribution to advancing the functional orthodontic treatment philosophy.

Dr. Bean has continued to research and teach these reliable techniques, and is now in his 51st year in dentistry. His many students over the years have, in several instances, become popular teachers of orthodontics.

Dr. Grant R.N. Bowbeer, D.D.S., M.S.

Dr. Bowbeer received his masters degree in 1969 from the graduate orthodontic program at the University of Michigan and has been in private practice since then in Ann Arbor. Dr. Bowbeer provided conventional orthodontics for 15 years, before he was awakened to functional treatment and superior esthetic results following a lecture by Dr. Merle Bean from Des Moines, Iowa back in April 1983. Over the next two years, he converted his practice to incorporate functional appliances and started a major project to determine just what are proper facial esthetics. Following this research he developed a diagnostic method that matches the facial esthetics of fashion models and movie stars. He has developed a facial analysis and cephalometric analysis that are both easy to use and understand.

Dr. Bowbeer's extraction rate on patients over the past 10 years has been reduced from 60% of patients down to 10% using these new techniques. Any type of backward pulling headgear is rarely used in his practice.

Dr. Bowbeer has been lecturing since 1985 on facial esthetics, proper orthodontic diagnosis, functional orthodontics, and TMJ treatment. He has lectured at several national meetings and to many study groups all over the United States, Canada and in several other countries around the world.

Dr. Bowbeer is a contributing editor for the publication "The Functional Orthodontist" and he has written a dozen articles on treatment based on facial esthetics and proper TMJ function.
