<p>Day 1: Wednesday September 20, 2006 Athens (Piraeus), Greece (Port of Departure 11pm)</p>		<p>No visit to Athens would be complete without a visit to the Acropolis. There you'll find the Parthenon, the largest building in the Acropolis and one of the world's most awe-inspiring sights. It was built as a temple to Athena and is still a remarkable structure today.</p>
<p>Day 2: Thursday September 21, 2006 Delos, Greece (8am–12pm)</p>		<p>Stroll through the amazing remnants of ancient temples on this uninhabited island, one of the most revered sanctuaries of antiquity. The legendary birthplace of Apollo, it was once a religious center for all of the Aegean. See the silent marble lions still on guard, the splendid mosaic floors in the temples dedicated to Apollo and feel its enduring power.</p>
<p>Day 2: Thursday September 21, 2006 Mykonos, Greece (2pm–10pm)</p>		<p>Mykonos' cosmopolitan character has made it famous as an international resort. A beautiful, picturesque island with an all-white town next to the crystal-clear blue waters of the Aegean Sea, Mykonos is an island that enchants its visitors with golden sand beaches, a lively atmosphere, friendly and easygoing people and an endless relation with the glorious past.</p>
<p>Day 3: Friday September 22, 2006 Rhodes, Greece (9am–6pm)</p>		<p>Rhodes is famous for being the island of sun, sea and sand—the ideal place for vacations. The history of Rhodes dates back to the ancient world. As you enter the harbor, you will be able to envision where the Colossus of Rhodes, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, was thought to have stood commanding and guarding the harbor entrance.</p>
<p>Day 4: Saturday September 23, 2006 Santorini, Greece (8am–6pm)</p>		<p>Santorini's spectacular caldera is a vestige of what was probably the biggest volcanic eruption in recorded history, believed by some to have caused the disappearance of Atlantis. The island's violent volcanic history is visible everywhere you look—in black-sand beaches, earthquake-damaged dwellings and raw cliffs of lava plunging into the sea.</p>

<p>Day 6: Monday September 25, 2006 Valletta, Malta (8am–6pm)</p>		<p>Valletta has many titles, all recalling its rich historical past. It is the “modern” city built by the Knights of St. John; a masterpiece of the baroque; a European Art City; and a World Heritage City. Admire the stunning scenery and wander through imposing churches, and down the streets of fortified towns where the Knights of St. John once held sway.</p>
<p>Day 7: Tuesday September 26, 2006 Taormina (Sicily), Italy (8am–6pm)</p>		<p>Located high above Naxos harbor, beautiful Taormina stands majestically along a ridge, surveying the fishing villages and marinas below and Mt. Etna in the distance. If you'd like, take a trip to the volcano itself and get a first-hand look at cones, craters and lava streams from previous eruptions and a fantastic view over the Gulf of Catania.</p>
<p>Days 8 & 9: Wednesday September 27, 2006 Sorrento/Capri, Italy (8am Wed–5am Thur)</p>		<p>Sorrento is (and has been for quite some time) one of the best known resorts in Italy. Sorrento is perched on a dramatic line of steeply rising cliffs, overlooking the Bay of Naples, on a stretch of coastline of great beauty, on the northern slope of the Sorrentine Peninsula.</p>
<p>Day 9: Thursday September 28, 2006 Amalfi/Positano, Italy (8am–3pm)</p>		<p>Stretching for 31 miles along a promontory from Sorrento to Salerno, this rugged region is some of Europe's most beautiful coastline. You'll see intensely blue waters and picture-postcard villages that cling to cliff walls. Chic Positano has a relaxed, sophisticated air and is draped around a sparkling bay filled with colorful fishing boats. Enchanting Amalfi is home to a 12th-century Capuchin monastery and a beautiful 11th-century Cathedral.</p>
<p>Day 10: Friday September 29, 2006 Florence/Pisa(Livorno), Italy (8am–8pm)</p>		<p>Livorno, in the Tuscan region of Italy, is ideally located for exploring some of the most beautiful cities in Italy, including Florence and Pisa. Florence is most noted as the birthplace of the Renaissance. Highlights include impressive piazzas and an incomparable 15th-century skyline—sure to offer charm and an unforgettable experience to any visitor.</p>
<p>Day 11: Saturday September 30, 2006 Rome (Civitavecchia), Italy Disembark Port (6am)</p>		<p>Civitavecchia is the gateway to all the magnificence of the ancient city of Rome.
